A. PURPOSE

The purpose of the policy is to establish and guide the framework for emergency management (EM) programs at all Old Dominion University illies.

B. AUTHORITY

<u>Crisis and Emergency Management Plan (CEMP)</u>: University'smain contingencyplanning document that provides a strage-level framework to effectively prevent, mitigateagainst, prepare for, respond to, and recover from-balazards incidents, emergenesis, and events.

Emergency- As defined by Code of Virginis ection 44-146.16 as amende dany occurrence, or threat thereof, whether natural or mammade, which results or may result in substantial injury or harm to the population or substantial damage to or loss of property abural resources

Emergency Management (EM)The coordination of efforts to prepare formal carry out the functions to prevent, minimize, espond to and recover from inciderst caused by natural hazardshuman-causedhazards, and acts terrorism.

Emergency Management Accreditation Program (EMAP) voluntary assessment and accreditation process for tale and local government emergency management programs. Accreditation is based on compliance with

<u>Emergency Notification System (ENS)</u>Colloquially known as ODU Kerts, the University's combined protocols, training, systems, and equipm used to provide emergency alorated notifications to the University community.

Emergency Operations Center (EOC) he physical virtual location at which the coordation of information and resources to support or scene incident emergency/event management activities takes place.

Essential Designated Personnel Exempt and nonexempt employees who are required to work during an authorized closing because their pions have been designatedly the hiring supervisor as essential to University operate during emergencies.

Exercise—A test of plans, policies, and/or procedures intended to validate the planning and training process as part of a larger preparednessignam. Execises can be is cussion based, including seminars, workshops, and tables pand operation based, including drills games, and functional and full cale exercises.

University units with essential program fortions (i.e., those units designated as fulfilling Mission Essential Function and/or Primary Business Functions within the University Continuity Plan) are required to maintain a current Departmental/Unit Continuity Plan. The Cortinuity Plan identifies departmental missionessential functions and details the primary business functions areasources (e.g., facilities, human capital, and IT) needed to perforthese functions when normal operations are disrupted Department headswill designate point of contact to work with OEM to annuallycomplete/update their Continuity Plan. As a best practical other University departments/units are encouraged to develop a Departmental/Unit Continuity Plan with OEM supptor

2. Training

A compehensive training curriculum is alessential component in furthering the preparedness goals diffe University's emergency management programPer Governor's Executive Order 41 (2019), all University employees are annually required to take the Emergency Management for State Employees aining module. Based on their roles and responsibilities in University incident response/recovery, selessential/designated personnel may be subject to participation inno or all of the following curricula National Incident Managemen System (NIMS) incident Command System (ICS) intinuity planning, Building Emergency Coordinator (BEG) ining, and/or other training to be developed and offered as needed OEM, with assitance from other key departments, coordinates the University's preparedness training program II training will be dievered in acordance with the current Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan (MYTEP), maintained by OEM.
